

#### **ABOUT OUR FAMILIES**

**37%** of the children had special needs.

**23%** were non-native English speakers.

**65%** qualified for services based on income.

**27%** of children served had experienced abuse or neglect. This is an 11% increase from last year.

**48%** of parents had reported family crisis such as domestic violence or substance abuse.

**100%** of Parents were working or attending school.

**8** parents obtained degrees during the year.


