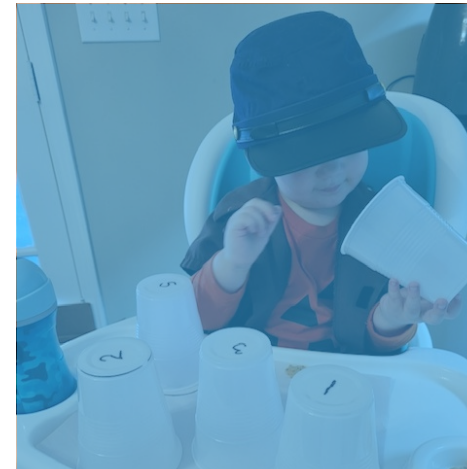




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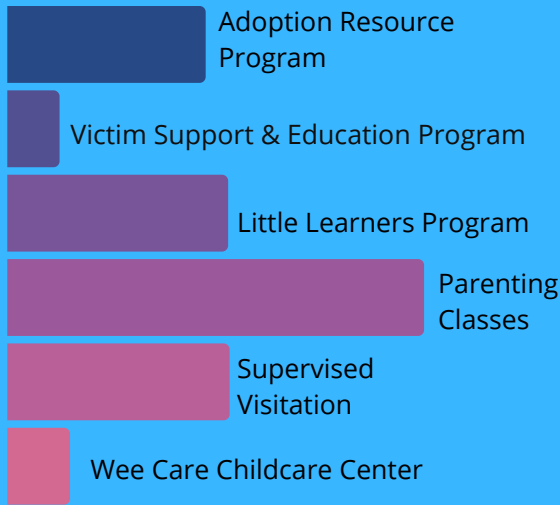


OVERALL IMPACT

ABOUT OUR FAMILIES

37% of the children had special needs.

23% were non-native English speakers.

65% qualified for services based on income.

27% of children served had experienced abuse or neglect. This is an 11% increase from last year.

48% of parents had reported family crisis such as domestic violence or substance abuse.

100% of Parents were working or attending school.

8 parents obtained degrees during the year.

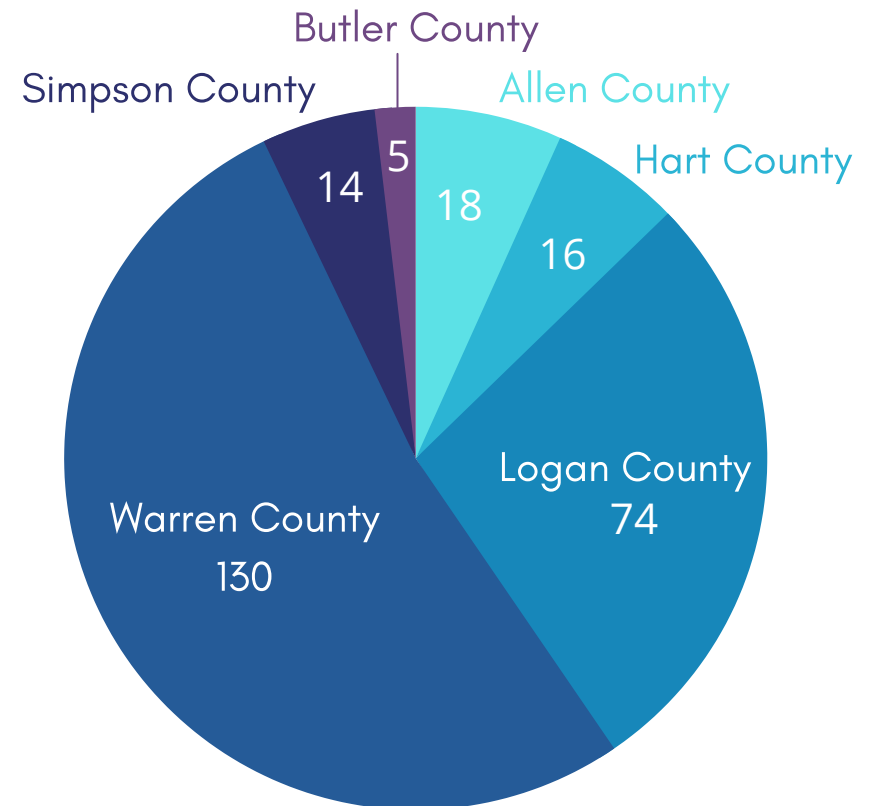
LITTLE LEARNERS PROGRAM

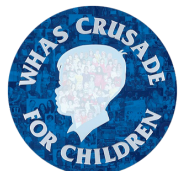
